Interview with Ivo Wiegersma

Internship at the Conrad Hotel 1 Sep 2006 – 2 Feb 2007

Could you briefly introduce yourself?

My name is Ivo Wiegersma, a 25 year old student from the Netherlands. I enjoy politics traveling and reading. Besides this I am a football fan, and love trying new things such as skydiving.

Why and how did you decide to do an internship in Turkey?
